# 1NT/1\* openings reminder

Please keep on announcing your 1NT and 1. openings, which is now standard across NZ and

Australia. So for 1NT it is '12-14', '15-17' or whatever your partnership agreement is. You <u>no</u> longer need to alert short 1\* bids because of the announcing. The announcement for 1\* is '2 plus' or '3 plus' or '4 plus' to indicate what minimum length of the club suit (and for the big clubbers, 'Strong 16+' or 'Strong 15+' etc. to tell the opponents that it just shows a point count and what the minimum number of points is).

If you don't hear an announcement after a 1.4 or 1NT openings from your opponents, then regardless of whether you are interested in bidding please gently remind the opener's partner that they are supposed to announce.

In total 39 hand patterns are possible, but only 13 of the combinations occur in more than one in one hundred hands. The 4-4-3-2 pattern, which occurs in more than one in five hands, is the most common and consists of two fourcard suits, a three-card suit and a doubleton.
