## Modest price increase For online sessions

As most members will be aware, Auckland Bridge Club (AKBC) has been very active in introducing online bridge to New Zealand through the RealBridge application, utilising the Hello Club membership system. We are pleased with the outcome, and hope you have been too. Online sessions were 'a life-saver' for many during the pandemic lockdowns, and since. Many players are just not in a position to attend club sessions (no local club, limited mobility, health issues, no regular partner or partner unavailable for similar reasons, session day and time not suitable), and those players that can and do also enjoy the additional online sessions. Members have rekindled partnerships where a former partner moved to a different city or country. Retired members have started playing again. Perhaps most importantly, we also have the opportunity to engage with players from all over the country, players we would never otherwise have the opportunity to meet. With the generous assistance of RealBridge and overseas experts we have been able to offer a number of unique events: four sets of free lessons from Andrew Robson (240 pairs), Bridge against the Ditch (124 pairs), 12 Hands with David Bird (64 pairs), 12 Hands with Kieran Dyke (23 pairs), Friendly match vs Queenstown and Wanaka clubs. More are planned. It has also provided a great forum for supervised and improver sessions.

The financial outcome from all this work has been a reasonable contribution towards overheads (but not enough to compensate for the impact of the pandemic). We would like to be able to continue offering a full schedule of online sessions and need to increase the normal table fee from \$5 to \$6, effective 1 September. This might not be the last increase. We should also mention the possibility that the outcome of the current NZ Bridge online strategy 'consultation' could be to kill these sessions off at the club level.

A number of members have indicated to us that they are appreciative of the efforts of the club to introduce RealBridge to New Zealand at a fairly low cost to members. Should anyone wish to do so, it is simple to make a donation from Hello Club - and since we are a registered charity, your donations may be tax deductible.




# Food for Thought Director Patrick

Partner opens 14 and we are initially very optimistic about game. Two aces and a king are excellent values. We start by responding our longest suit with 14.

Partner rebids 2♣ and our optimism vanishes. Hands with no fit and shortages in each other's suits play very poorly. Even if partner had 14 points, which would give us 25, normally enough for game, we would still be well advised to stay low.

This is a 2♥ rebid. There is no need to panic and pass 2♣ even though partner should have 6 of them. The only game that we might make is 4♥. If partner can raise to 3♥ we are worth a go at game. But if partner gives preference to 2♠ we should pass like a shot. On the actual hand partner has an easy pass:



It is a simple sequence. Why did only 1 N/S pair out of 15 duplicate those bids?

For undisciplined Norths who continued with 2NT and emerged with 8 tricks consider how you would like the hand if I moved the K♦ into the spade suit:

- J
- KQ9
- KQ9853
- K8743

A872

- A843

For the 2NT bidders, the good news was that partner had 11 points. They could have had a lot fewer. Unfortunately that meant some of them bid 3NT.
