When he first started coaching in 1959, Walter Nash was Prime Minister, the Beatles were yet to be formed and construction had just finished on the (four lane) Auckland Harbour Bridge. He later guided John Walker's legendary career and has helped many others with their track and field events. Arch retired from coaching in 2000, content to put more time into bridge ("I'm addicted to it") and lawn bowls.

Three possible losers. He carefully ruffed with the \P 7 to preserve the \P 2 as an entry should the hearts split 1-1 for a guaranteed line for 1off. But they didn't. Nothing left but to run a lot of hearts, and his luck was in: after some injudicious diamond discards by LHO, the \blacklozenge Ace felled the singleton \blacklozenge K, wrapping up 13 tricks and a 100% board.

A player with less than 5 A & B Points is classified as "Novice". On reaching an aggregate of 100 Master Points, a Local Master who has not earned 50 A Points is accorded the status of Local Master - 1 Star. At 150 Master Points he becomes Local Master - 2 Star, with an additional Star for each additional 50 Master Points if he has not attained sufficient A Points. Similarly stars are awarded to masters of other ranks who have not attained sufficient A points for promotion to a higher rank. e.g.A one-star National Master will have acquired 700 plus total Points but not yet attained 250 A Points to move to the rank of Life Master

Q& A on proposed union with Remuera Bowling Club (RBC)

Why?

A slowly declining membership accelerated during the last couple of years by Covid means it is necessary to address the Club's future. We have cost overruns which are not sustainable long term. All expenditure has been reviewed and controlled where possible, meaning a big increase in participation is our only option for a brighter horizon.

What is the proposal?

To create a vibrant, multi-sport, multi-activity centre at RBC's Market Road site. We believe the clubs can be better together with renovated facilities, new offerings, modern fittings, attractive and fit for purpose premises. We want to add a social dimension to our club with a proper café and bar. In short, we want you to use Market Road for more than bridge.

To date approximately \$4,000 has been spent on early investigative concept work, without commitment. We want to ensure members are onboard with a full understanding of the Boards vision, so briefings for members and visits to RBC's 6 Market Road premises are being planned. If the proposal progresses both memberships will have opportunities to vote.

The proposal is that the clubs equally fund Resource Consent application(s) to

- add 50 parking spaces to Market Road making 100 in total (there are 60 at Remuera Road).
- remodel and upgrade the existing Market Road clubrooms, add new bridge playing areas and a commercial café/bar.
- install a new lift and build an entrance atrium.

Consents might cost each club \$50,000. We have a detailed Planner's Report which suggests a positive outcome. However, either club may withdraw at any time during consenting but would have to pay the other club's costs. Consents could take 12 months to October 2023 before architects, engineers and constructors are engaged. Armed with satisfactory consents we would sell 273 Remuera Road and merge the two clubs.

An optimistic timeline is to move to Market Road in December 2024. Should temporary premises be required we will re-visit venues such as Ellerslie racecourse. The proceeds from the sale of 273 Remuera Road will pay for the Market Road upgrade and leave a surplus to invest.

At all stages we will engage professionals for advice on tax, legal structures, design, and matters arising. The Incorporated Society Act does not allow funds to be distributed to members.

What other options have been explored?

- Move to a smaller site: at least 20 sites have been considered, and none possessed four qualities: felt safe, plenty of parking, attractive and nearby.
- Sell a slice of our land: As a big section it is more valuable than as multiple small sections
- More rentals and grants: Rental returns are insufficient and grant bodies are reluctant to help.
- Increase subscriptions and table money: some members are happy to pay more, others won't. It is a competitive world, and we think the increased income from price rises would quickly disappear. On-line bridge has changed behaviour.
- Ask for donations: few people gift their precious money to cover on-going operating expenses relying on donations isn't a viable or bankable business strategy.

Tell me about RBC

RBC, just a few minutes' walk away, is a wonderful but run-down site with potential and space. We can't think of a better nearby property to call home - it could be fabulous. We've been talking with RBC on-and-off for seven years. RBC owns their 12,200 m2 site freehold (AKBC 3,520 m2). Their land is valued at \$5.5 million by Auckland Council as playing fields, our premises at \$18.25 million. RBC has 150 members, AKBC 655 (plus about 1,000 visitor/casual members). RBC's financial outlook is stable, partly because they hold popular business bowls events during summer.

How much will rejuvenating Market Road cost?

Millions, and we won't know until professionals work it all out and this won't happen until after satisfactory consents are granted by Auckland Council.

How will it run?

The proposal code named Market Road Clubs (MRC) will comprise of the assets of both clubs. MRC will have a board looking after and administering the property as well as matters such as billing. Committees representing each activity - initially bowling and bridge - ensuring that busy bowls and bridge days do not clash. A commercial standard bar and café are an important part of the new offering. We want your club to be more than just a bridge venue, and in the future, it may be appropriate to add extra activities to the Market Road offer.
