A consistently strong performance in the qualifying where they did not lose a match (their smallest victory was by 12 IMPs) gave them an imposing carryover of 36.5 IMPs.

Their opponents – Janet Barnard, Nola Clark, Sylvester Riddell and Stephen Goodman – had a Herculean task to catch them up in the 28 board final. In fact Linda Cartner's team added another 32 IMPs to their carryover by winning the final and increasing the margin of victory to 68.5 IMPs

Roy Ballard, Trudy Lange, Jo Clark and Peter Goffin started with an 8.5 IMP carryover and defeated Leslie Watt's team by 15 IMPs in their playoff to win 3<sup>rd</sup> place by 23.5 IMPs

Russell Watt's team started with a slender 2.5 IMP lead, but the minimal carryover was not needed as they beat Bruce Fisher's team by 22 IMPs to secure 5<sup>th</sup> place

Gay Bradbury's team finished 7<sup>th</sup>. They had a carryover of 10.5 IMPs and added another 5 IMPs in their match against Elizabeth Grieve's team.

Every team who had carryover into their playoff not only defended that carryover, but added to it.
