

This was an interesting hand for a number of reasons.

I started by investigating the first call on the North hand.

There were 21 tables playing and this is the result of my research:

Pass - 11 2♠ - 9 1♣ - 1

It is a good hand for those people that play a Multi 2♦ and can open 2♠ showing a 5 card suit with a 4+ minor. The fact that less than half the field opened 2♠ surely means that less than half the field have that option. Something I find surprising.

I was also surprised at a few of the tables where North did open 2 , but yet South with Q3 of support in the trump suit managed to hog the contract in hearts. Yes, they were hogs, although I would obviously never call them Hideous Hogs. Perhaps they believed their partner was a rabbit. As you can make more tricks in spades than hearts, I am sure they were Rueful Rabbits.

With two good suits I would not want to stay silent if I was playing with someone who only played natural weak twos. I would rather get involved either by opening 2 to show a 6 card suit or by upgrading my hand 1 point to open at the 1 level.

Most people play that they open 1 of a suit with 10 points if they have 5-5 shape. Which is the better hand?

**♦** KJ875 ♥ 2 ♦ 93 **♣** AJ1085 or **♦** KJ432 ♥ 2 ♦ J3 **♣** AJ742

I prefer the first one, so I have no qualms about a 1 point upgrade to open it.

My choice with 5-5 in the blacks is to open 1, but not everyone agrees with me.
